Accessible by Routes 47, 56, 63 and 64, all of which connect to the Meadowview light rail station.

Regional Transit is holding a public hearing to accept public comment on the South Line Phase II Draft Environmental Impact Report (DEIR). The South Line Phase II project includes a four mile light rail extension from the current end point of Meadowview Road to Cosumnes River College. The 45-day public comment period will end on April 3, 2007.

Understanding the Route 38 Schedule

Although the Route 38 schedule was adjusted during the January 7, 2007 service changes, the route and a.m. schedule has remained the same. To alleviate any confusion when reading the schedule, RT would like to suggest the following tips:



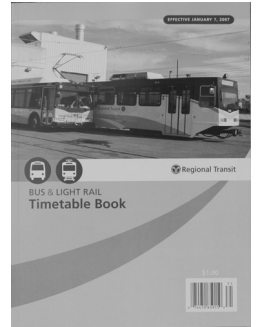
When traveling through the loop of 5th Street, Vallejo Way and Muir Way before 1 p.m., understand that the Operator layover will take place **before** going through the loop.

When traveling through the loop of 5th Street, Vallejo Way and Muir Way after 1 p.m., understand that the Operator layover will take place **after** going through the loop.

All stops previously served by Route 38 are still served on the current schedule, however before 1 p.m., the stops between 5th and Broadway and 8th and Broadway are included on the outbound schedule and after 1 p.m. on the inbound schedule.

Be Safe when Riding RT

RT Police Services wants to remind all RT patrons to take steps to enhance your personal safety. Always be alert and aware of the people around you. Avoid talking to strangers, especially in isolated areas. If carrying a purse, hold it tightly and close to your body; if carrying a wallet, keep it in a front pocket.

Light Rail: When waiting for a train, stay in a central location that is occupied by other patrons (it's true that there is safety in numbers). During off hours, ride as near to the train operator as possible. If someone bothers you, move to another seat or car and notify the train operator.

When walking to your car, walk briskly and confidently. Scan the area as you walk and be aware of the people in the area. If someone looks suspicious, move away from him/her. Go back to the station and notify security. Have your keys out and ready before you reach your vehicle.

Bus: Try to avoid isolated bus stops. Stand near others and in well-lighted areas and move to your bus as it arrives. During off hours, ride as near the bus driver as possible. If trouble occurs, notify the bus driver.

All Operators and Security Officers have the ability to contact Police Services via radio if assistance is needed.
