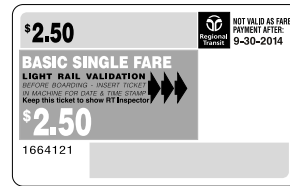

Pre-Paid Ticket and Pass Exchange

(December 1 – February 29)

Effective January 1, 2012, RT buses and light rail fare vending machines will not accept pre-paid tickets and passes with a December 31, 2011 expiration date.




During a three-month period, which began on December 1, customers may exchange Basic and Discount single fare tickets or daily passes for new fare media (September 30, 2014 expiration date). RT fares will remain the same.

RT will conduct even exchanges of fare media (December 31, 2011 expiration date) through February 29, 2012 at:

Making Progress on Smart Card System

RT and the Sacramento Area Council of Governments continue to make progress on developing a smart card system that will allow public transit riders in the region to pay for all bus and light rail trips with one form of fare media.

The smart card works like cash or a pass, automatically tracking the value of different fares by simply tapping the card on a special reader as you board. The smart card system will feature a plastic card that can store value and be reloaded.

RT recently began the installation of smart card system infrastructure at light rail stations, which includes new electrical wiring, poles, foundations and hardware for future fare vending machines. The initial focus will be on seven pilot light rail stations – Glenn, Iron Point, Sunrise, Butterfield, 29th Street, 13th Street and Meadowview – and will continue throughout the year.
