Regional Transit will conduct two public workshops on January 9 and 10 at 6:00 p.m. in the RT Auditorium (1400 29th Street) to receive community input concerning the proposed amendment to the Short Range Transit Plan (SRTP) for 2008 through 2010.

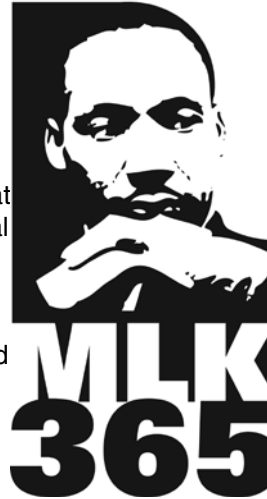
The SRTP will include the most recent information on the Title VI Assessment, operating statistics, ridership by route, the fiscal year 2007 budget, the five year Capital Plan, RT's Vision and Strategic Plan and the Fleet Management Plan. In addition to the workshops, a draft of the SRTP will be included on the RT website (www.sacrt.com) with opportunities for public input via email.

A public hearing is scheduled for January 22, 2007 to consider community input obtained from the workshops for the SRTP update. The public hearing will be held during the RT Board Meeting at 6 p.m. in the RT Auditorium (1400 29th Street).

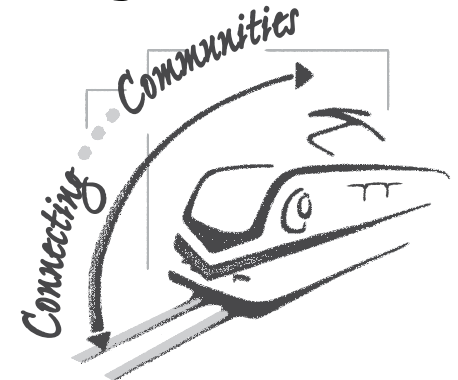

Gold Line Light Rail Extension to the Sacramento Valley Station

On December 8, RT opened the Gold Line light rail extension to the Sacramento Valley Station connecting the Sacramento region to the Capitol Corridor regional rail service and Amtrak national rail service.

In conjunction with the opening of the Gold Line light rail extension to the Sacramento Valley Station, the St. Rose of Lima Park light rail station (7th and K and 9th and K) is now only served by trains operating on the Blue Line (between Watt/I-80 and Meadowview). Gold Line trains no longer serve the St. Rose of Lima light rail station.

When traveling towards Sunrise/Folsom from the 7th and K area, please board a Gold Line train at the 7th and Capitol light rail station. If you are unable to walk to 7th and Capitol, the 8th and K light rail station is also served by the Gold Line, however the train will continue on to the Sacramento Valley Station before traveling towards Sunrise/Folsom. Other downtown light rail transfers include:

To Transfer from the Gold Line (from Historic Folsom) to the Blue Line (to Watt/I-80)

Passengers may transfer at the following light rail stations:

- 16th Street
- 13th Street
- Archives Plaza
- 8th and O
- 8th and Capitol
- 8th and K to St. Rose of Lima Park (9th and K)
(Exit at the 8th and K light rail station, walk South on 8th Street, East on K Street to board the Blue Line at the St. Rose of Lima Park light rail station)

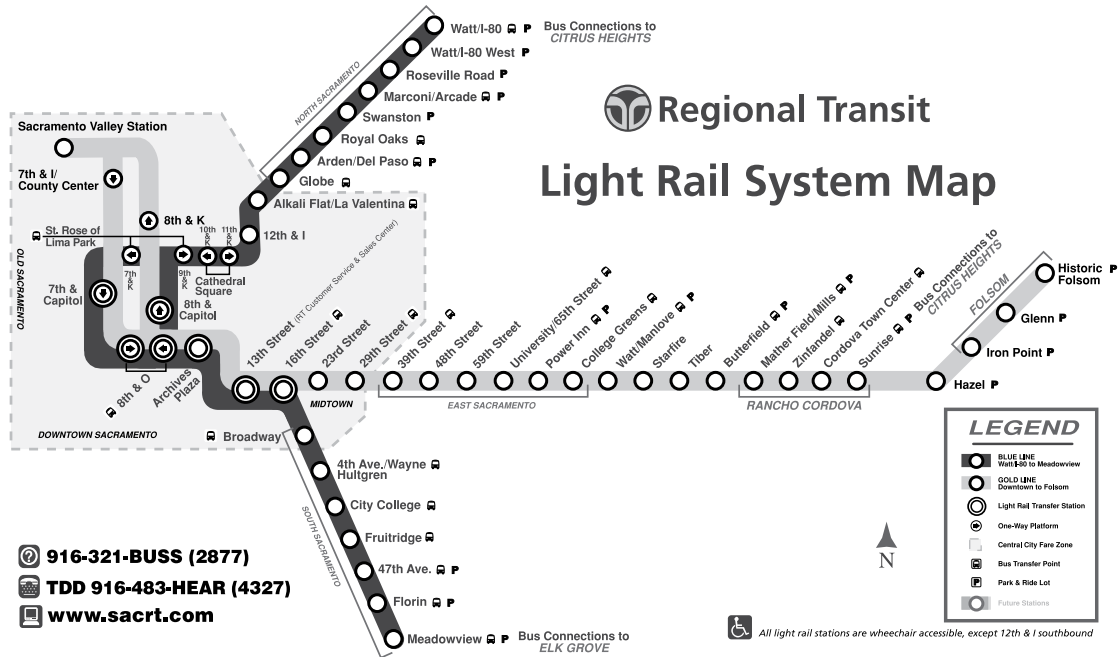
To Transfer from the Gold Line (from Historic Folsom) to the Blue Line (to Meadowview)

Passengers may transfer at the following light rail station:

- 16th Street (timed connections)

To Transfer from the Gold Line (from Sacramento Valley Station) to the Blue Line (to Watt/I-80)

Exit at the 7th and Capitol light rail station, walk South on 7th St., East on Capitol Ave. and South on 8th Ave. to board the Blue Line at the 8th and Capitol light rail station.



To Transfer from the Gold Line (from Sacramento Valley Station) to the Blue Line (to Meadowview)

Passengers may transfer at the following light rail stations:

- 7th and Capitol
- 8th and O
- Archives Plaza
- 13th Street
- 16th Street

To Transfer from the Blue Line (from Watt/I-80) to the Gold Line (to Sacramento Valley Station)

Exit at the St. Rose of Lima Park light rail station (7th and K), walk East on K Street and North on 8th Street to board the Gold Line at the 8th and K light rail station.

To Transfer from the Blue Line (from Watt/I-80) to the Gold Line (to Historic Folsom)

- 8th and O

- 13th Street
- 16th Street
